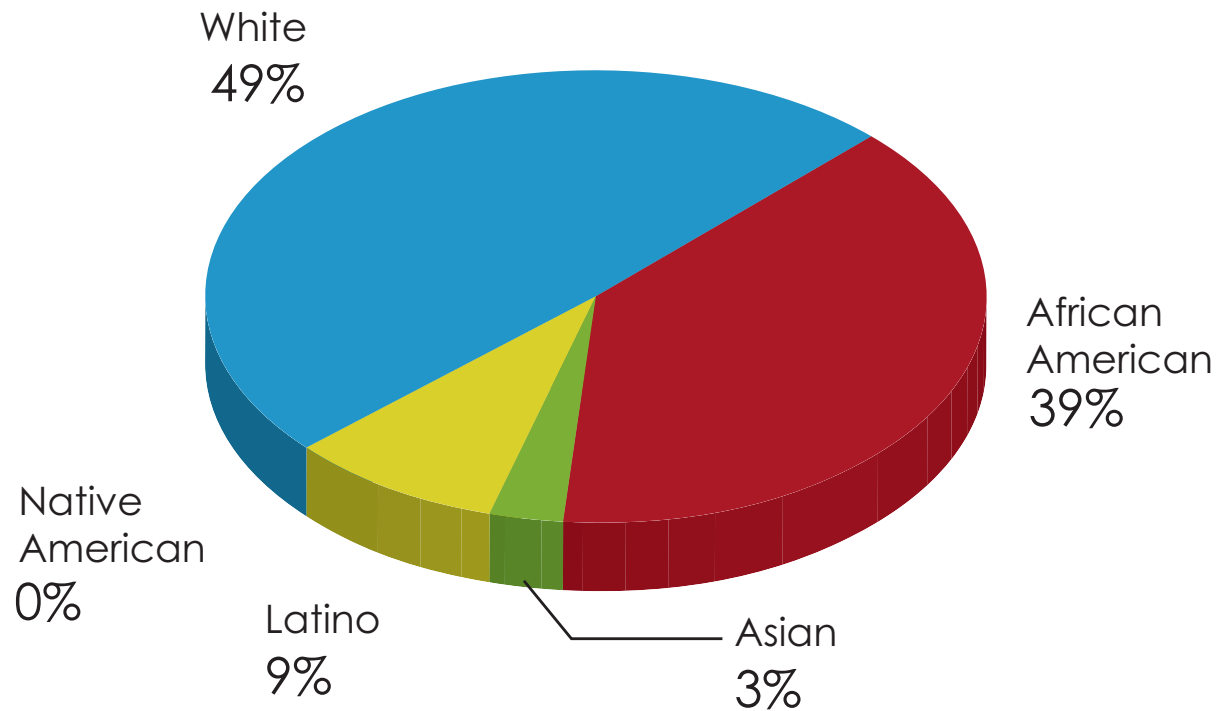


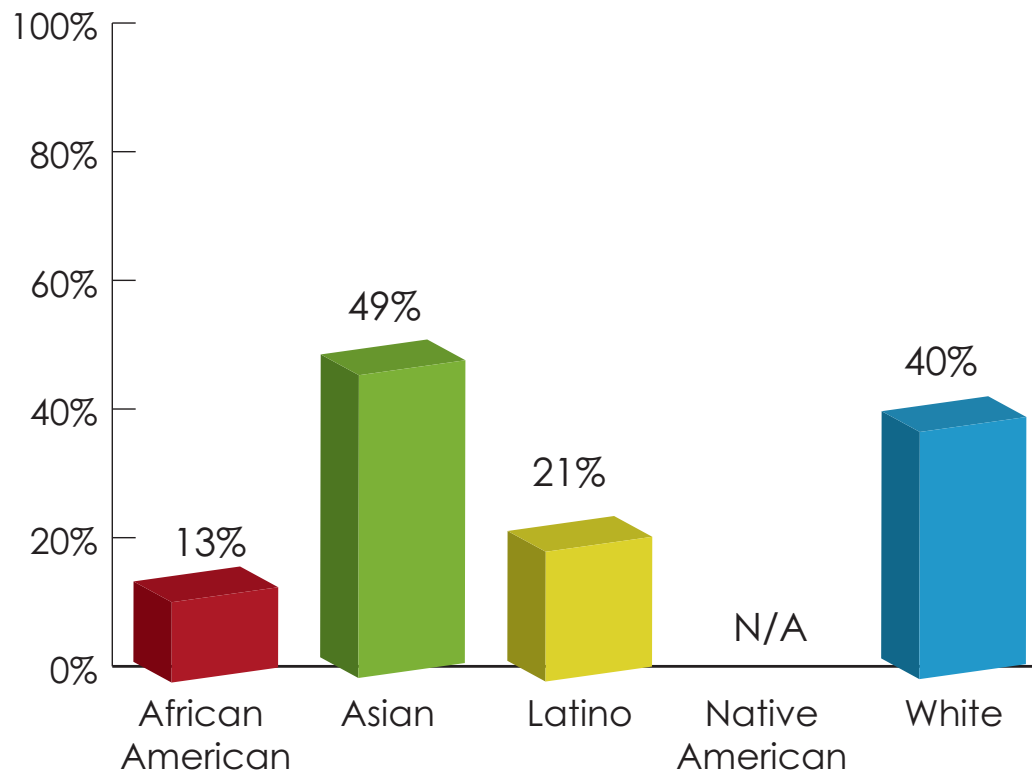
Public K-12 Enrollment, 2005-06

(1,521,951 total students)



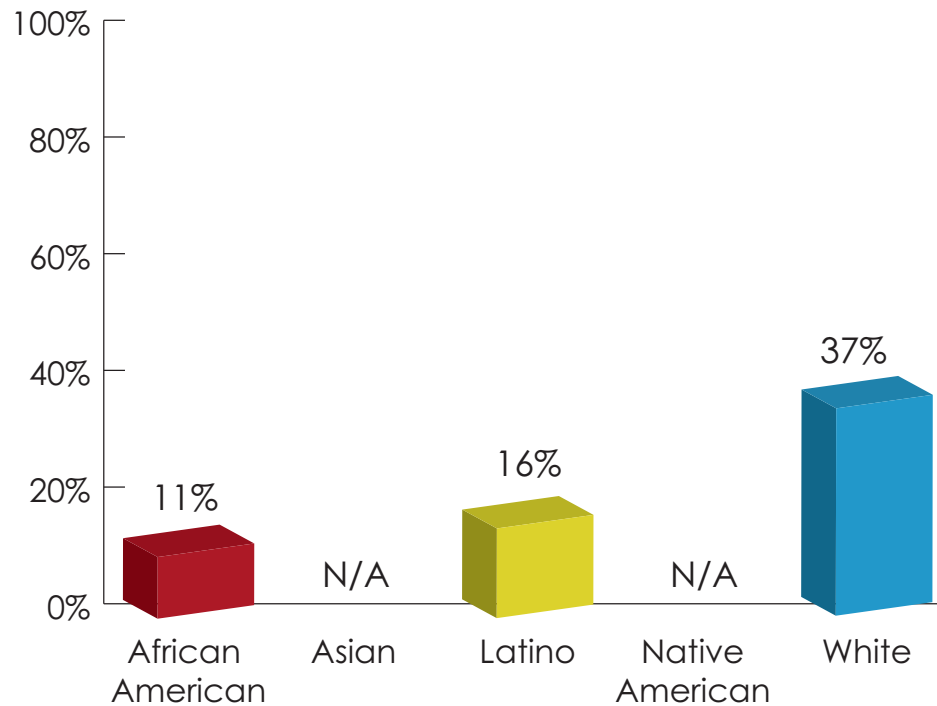

Reading: Fourth-Grade Students Scoring Proficient or Higher on NAEP in 2007



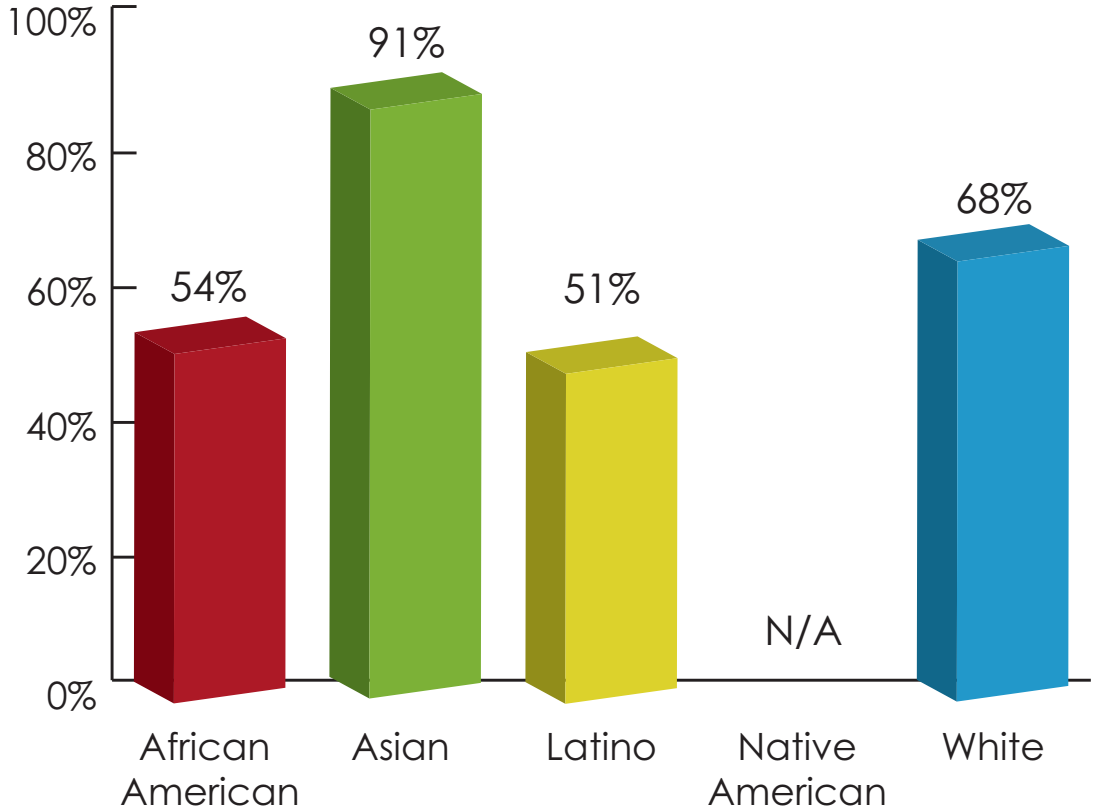

Math: Eighth-Grade Students Scoring Proficient or Higher on NAEP in 2007



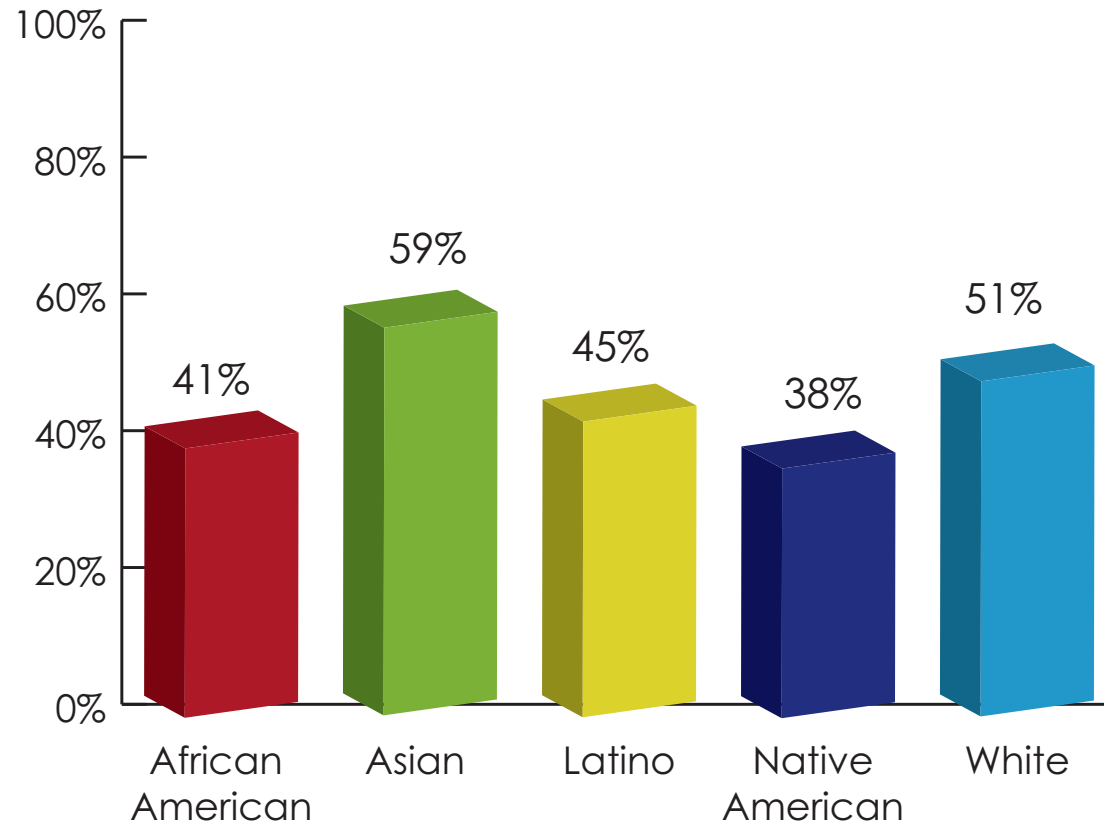

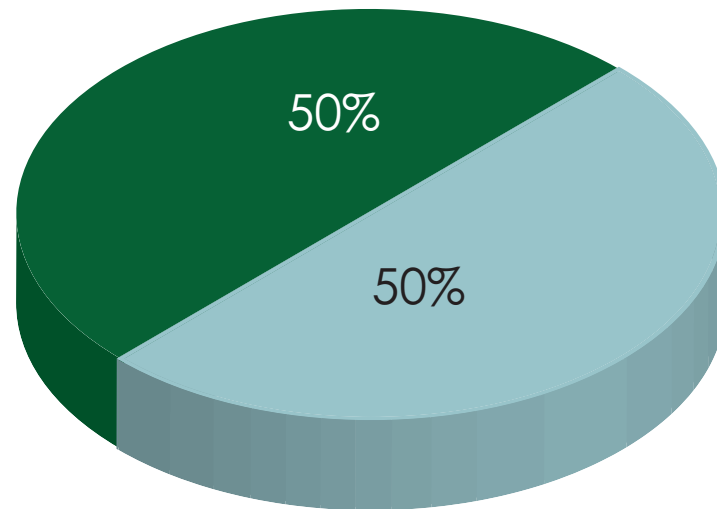
Public College Graduation Rates

% eligible for free and reduced-price lunch

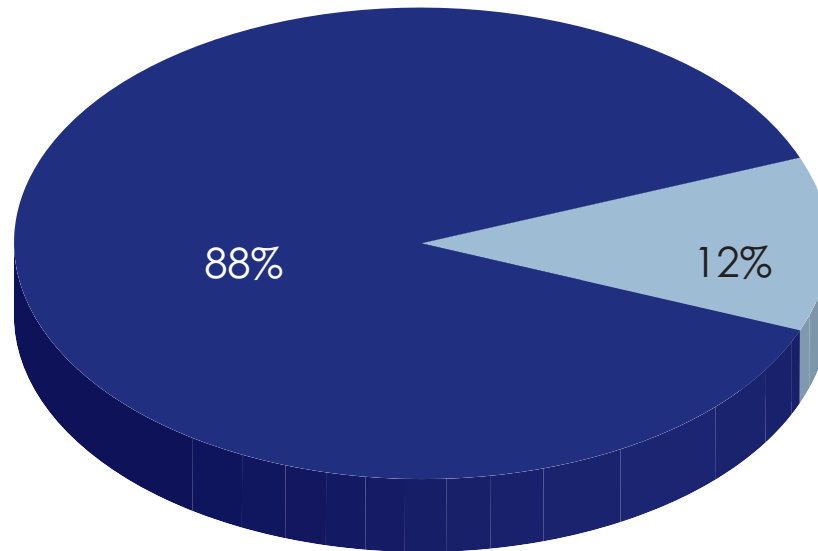

Students With Disabilities, 2005-06

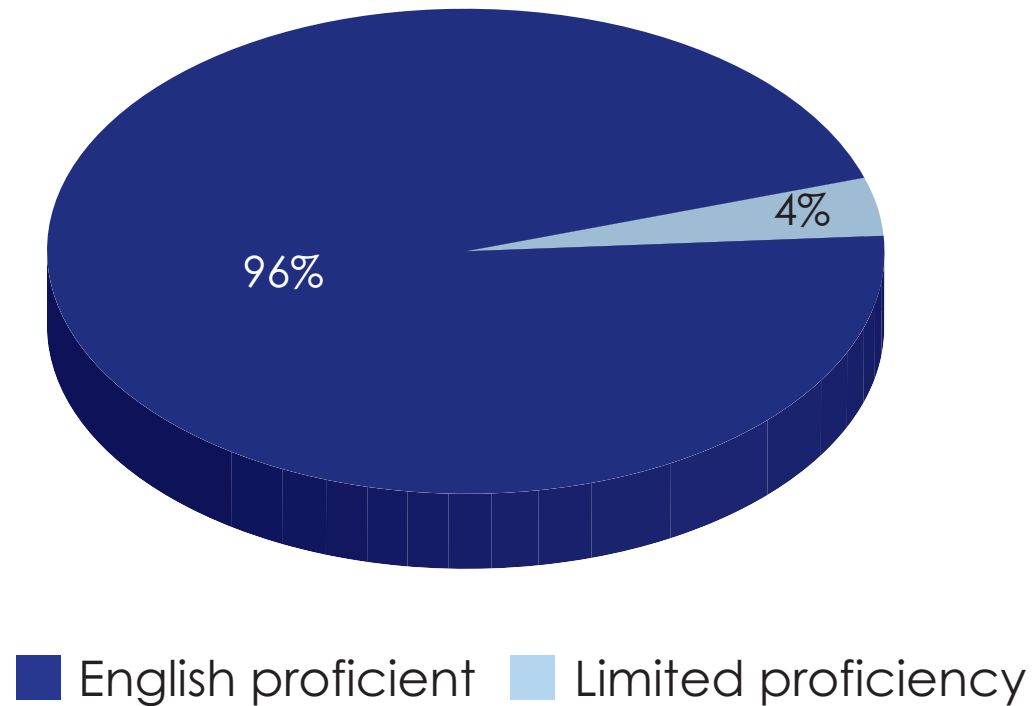

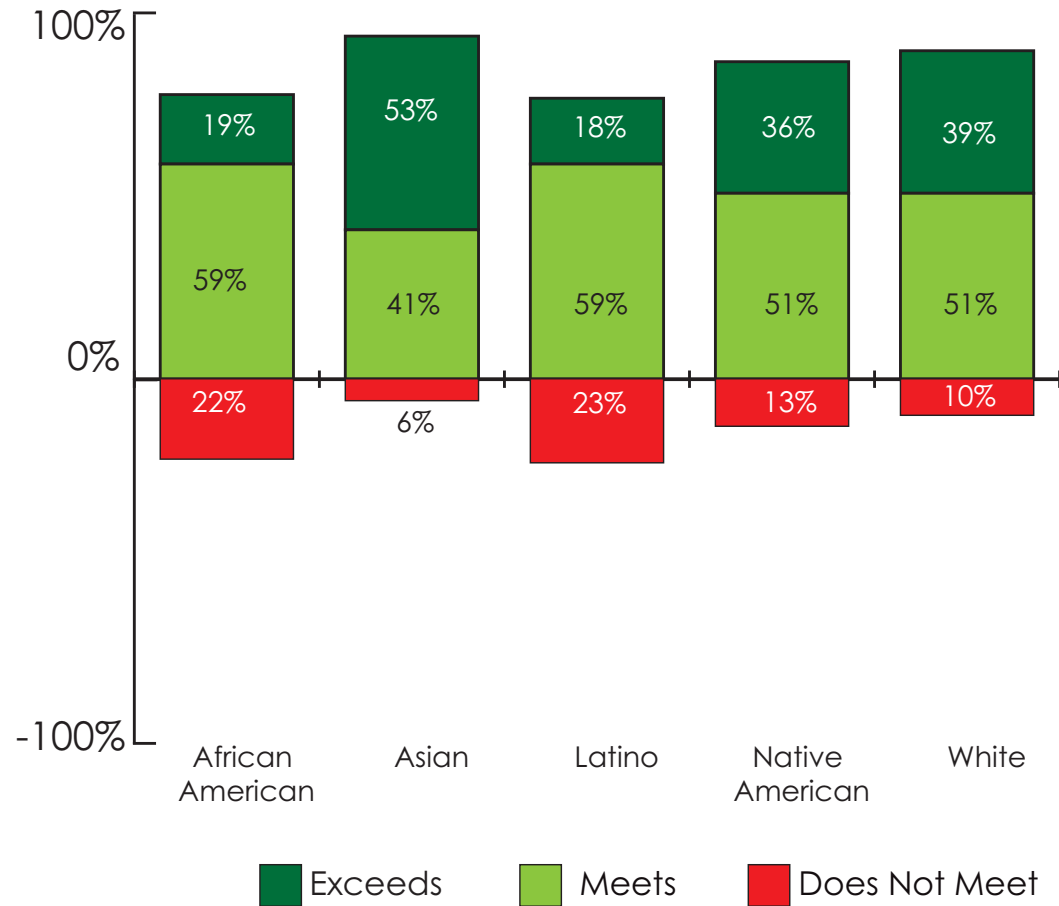

% of students with Limited English Proficiency



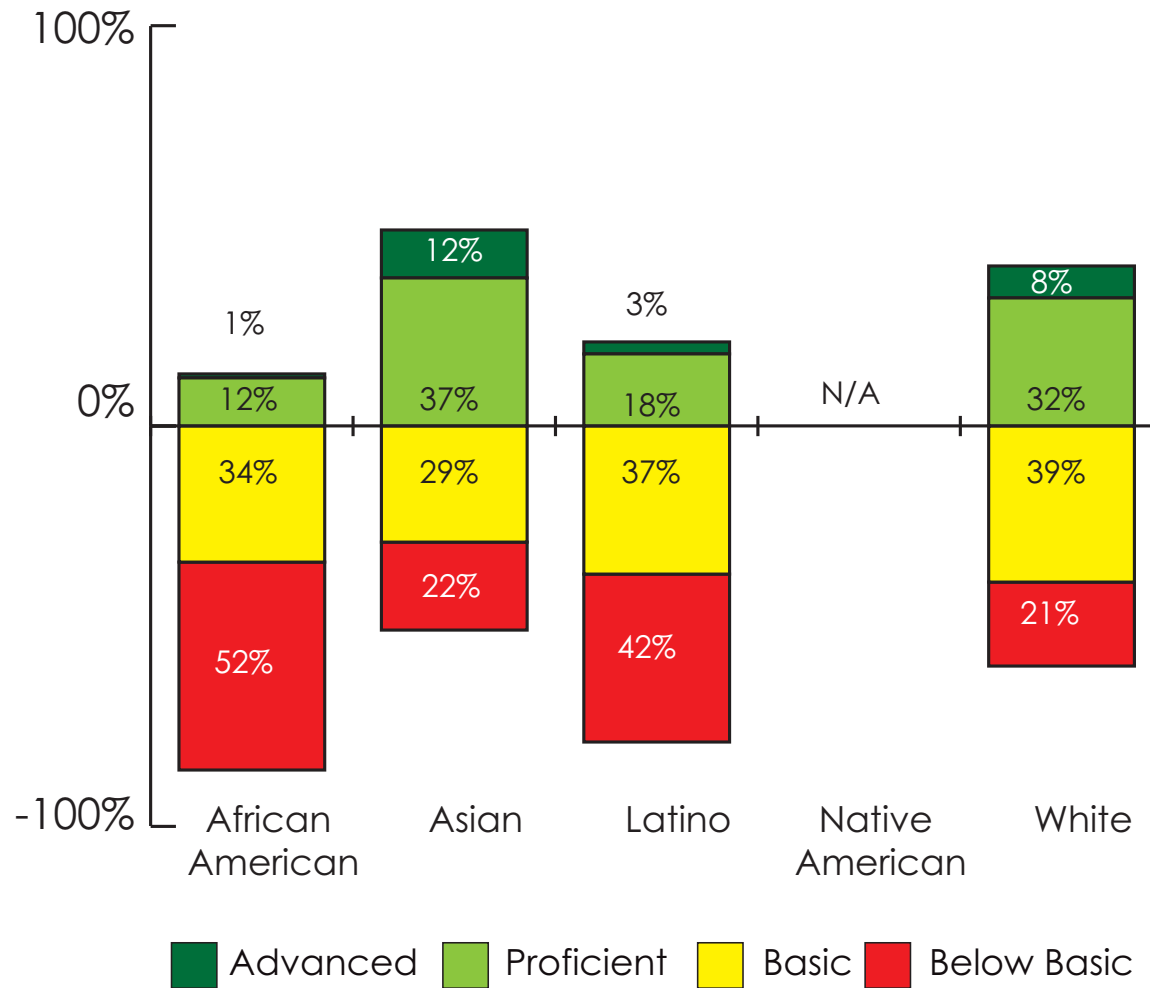
2007 Georgia Competency Tests Grade 4 Reading

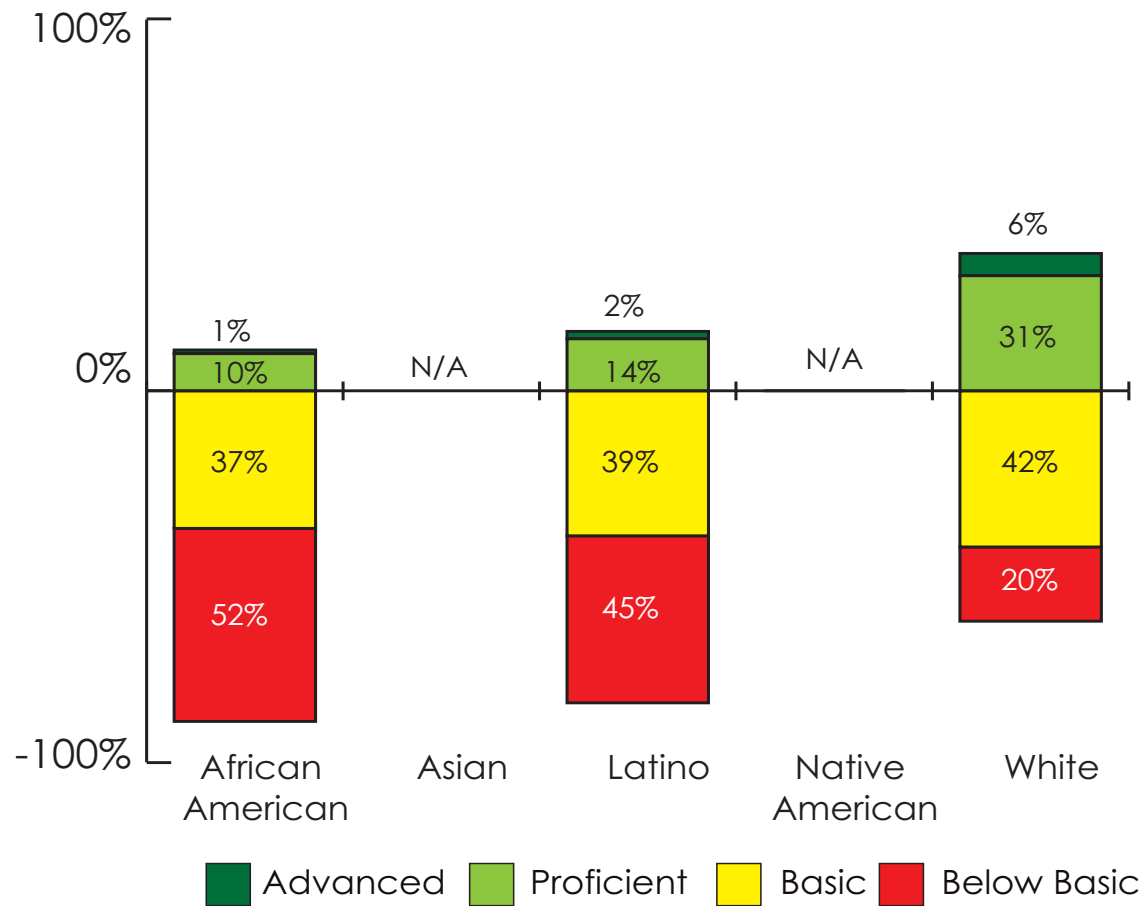

Grade 8 Math



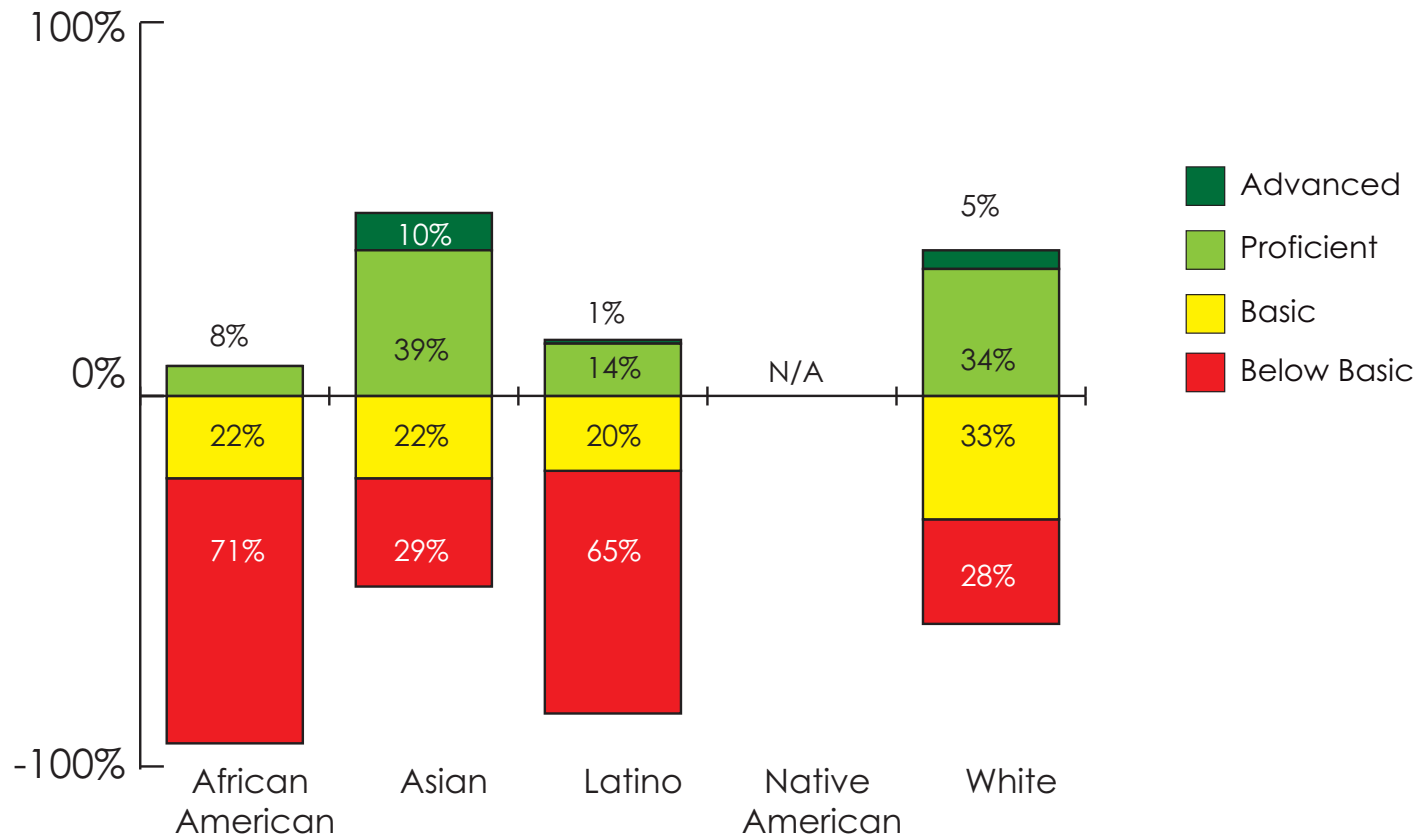

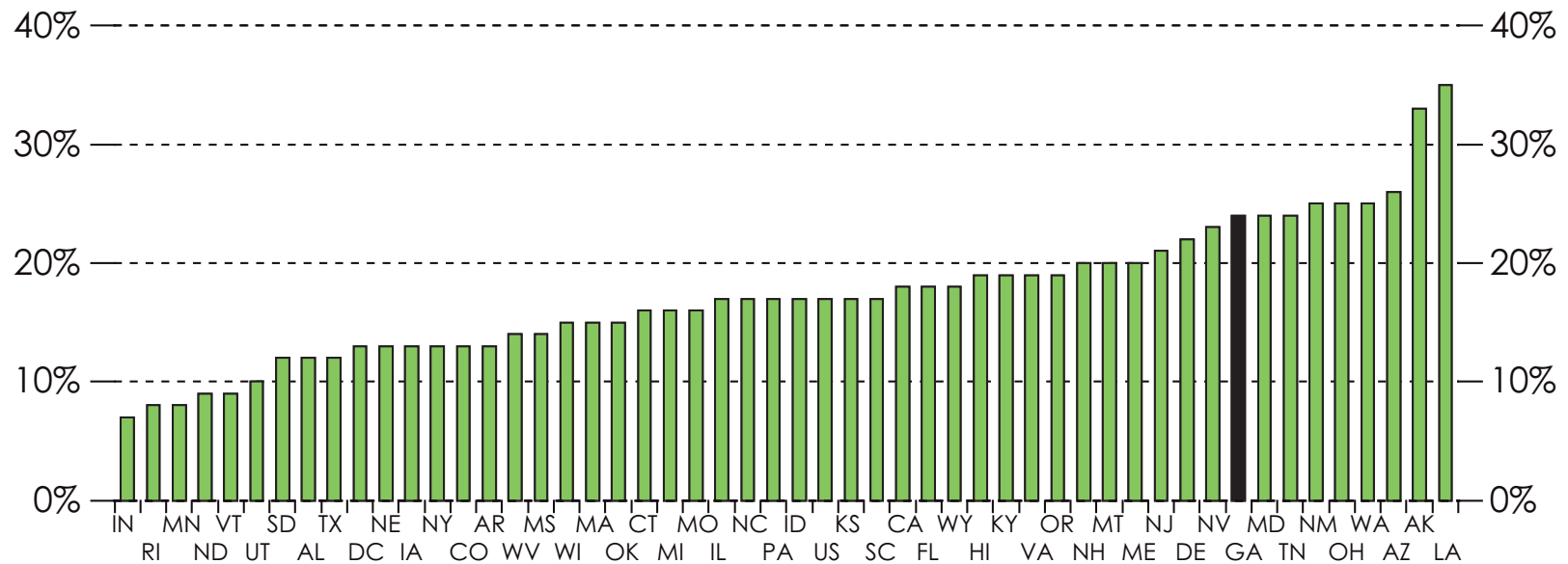
